- 5.2. An entrant can only compete in one age grouping or grading.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 5.3. Females will compete against females unless they specify that they wish to enter a unisex event. Some events may combine various age / sex divisions eg. 5000 metres.
- 5.4. Where insufficient entries are received in age group events, the entrant will be offered the opportunity to participate in a lower age group.
- 5.5. **SAPES Games medals will be presented to the first three placegetters in each competition.** Non-playing coaches must register and enter an event to be eligible for medals. Medals awarded are Gold – 1st, Silver – 2nd, Bronze – 3rd.
If there is only one competitor for an individual event, that person may compete in the lower age grouping / higher grade, however the time or score will stand as a record for their ACTUAL age grouping / grade. A medal will be awarded even though there are no other competitors in their age group.
6. **Medal Presentations** will be made at the conclusion of the final of each event. Placegetters who do not attend medal presentation ceremonies **MUST** arrange delivery of their medals through the Sports Coordinator.
7. Doubles and Teams **MUST** firstly come from within the same agency. Age divisions do not apply in Doubles or Team events and retired members may compete in any Doubles or Team event. Competitors may only compete in one team per sport. Team members **MUST** play in the preliminaries to be eligible for the finals. The end decision rests with the Sports Coordinator.
- 8.1 Where a person wishes to compete in a team or a doubles event, and is unable to locate sufficient numbers to make up an agency team, or is unable to find a partner for a doubles event, that person's entry will be set aside until after the closing date for entries. A draw will then be conducted from those individual entries with the view to making a composite team and that entrant will be able to compete. Please contact the Sport Coordinator to organise.

This event will be conducted at Port Hughes on Monday 3rd May 2010. A briefing will be conducted at 0700 hours, the competition will commence at 0730 hours and competitors must be back at the boat ramp at 1600 hours.

Competitors are to either provide their own boat, equipment, bait and transport for this competition or at their own expense make arrangements with a charter boat. The South Australian Police and Emergency Services Games and the event coordinators have no responsibility for any arrangements made with a charter boat.

Competition Guidelines:

Species must have been:

- Caught on either a hand line or rod and reel (no net fishing or spearing)
- Caught without assistance by other persons (however an assistant may gaff or net the specie)
- Caught within the competition boundaries and within the time limits set by the coordinators
- A maximum of two lines per person and two hooks per line may be in use at any one time
- The competition will be catch and release (this does not mean that you must release any specie that you are legally entitled to keep if you wish but rather in the interests of conservation you may release any or all of your fish and still score the same amount of points)
- Bag limits which apply to recreational fishing apply to this competition. Catches may be inspected to ensure compliance with Legislation.
- All boats will be inspected for appropriate safety equipment and sea worthiness prior to competition. Any boats failing the inspection will not be able to compete

Ranking Results:

1. *Mixed Bag*

- Competitors will receive five points for each of the first five nominated specie they catch.
- A sixth fish of the same specie will receive ten points. For example: the first five King George Whiting caught will receive five points each (25 points). A sixth King George Whiting will receive ten points (35 points). No further points can be obtained by catching more King George Whiting.

SPORT NUMBER 01 - ANGLING (SALT WATER BOAT)

- There will be six target species, which will include: King George Whiting, Snapper, Garfish, Tommy Roughts, Snook and Squid.
- The highest possible score will be 210 points (if six of each species are caught).
- Should more than one individual tie in their total points the individual or team which reports back to the boat ramp first will win.
- A person can only enter as an individual, there is no team category.
- There is no restrictions on individuals fishing from one boat (multiple entrants can fish from the same boat).

2. Longest King George Whiting

- Each competitor will present their longest King George Whiting to the judges.
- The judges will measure and record the length of the fish.
- The judge's measurement is final; there will be no re-measures or appeals relating to results.

3. Longest Snapper

- Each competitor will present their Snapper to the judges.

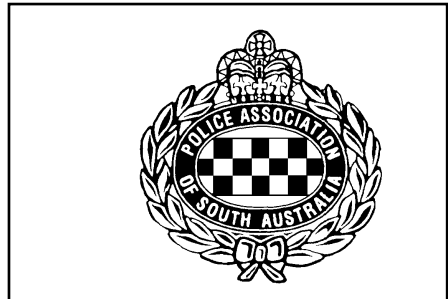
